# WHO ARE WE?

The Grenada Sustainable Development Trust fund Inc. was established as a Community-Based Non-Profit Organization in 2016 as part of the Sustainable Financing & Management of Eastern Caribbean Marine Ecosystems Project, with contributions from the Global Environment Facility (GEF), World Bank The Nature Conservancy (TNC) and KfW.

### **BIG BAY TELESCOPE COASTAL CLEAN-UP**

Our first event was in recognition of World Coastal Cleanup Day.

On September 23rd, 2023, the GSDTF Volunteers collaborated with St. George's University Student Associations (Education, Conservation and Outreach - ECO, Caribbean Students Association - CASA) GSDTF, Grenada Fund for Conservation - GFC and Sandals Foundation Grenada executed a massive coastal cleaned-up at Big Bay, Telescope, St. Andrew.
