Secretariat: Overseen by the CEO and supported by the Administrative Assistant and Program Officer, the Secretariat is responsible for managing the organization's daily operations.



Technical Advisory Committee (TAC): A diverse panel of experts that reviews and recommends project proposals based on merit and alignment with strategic goals.

- Call for Proposals Issued: Request for Proposals shared via GSDTF website, media, and partners.
- Concept Note Submission: Eligible organizations submit brief project overviews.
- Initial Screening: Secretariat screens notes for eligibility and completeness.
- **TAC Review:** TAC scores proposals and shortlists candidates.
- Full Proposal Submission: Shortlisted applicants develop detailed proposals.
- Evaluation & Recommendations: TAC reviews full proposals and recommends awards.
- Evaluation & Recommendations: TAC reviews full proposals and recommends awards.
- Grant Agreement & Implementation:
 Contracts signed; projects launched with reporting obligations.
- Monitoring & Evaluation: Progress tracked via reports, site visits, and performance metrics.
